Lemon Shoot - September 10, 2005 - The LEMON SHOOT course-of-fire is set up to encourage precision and varmint shooters to dust off their rifles and hone up their shooting skills. It's challenging but fun to shoot. The target is a full size woodchuck (Bulls Eye Mfg.) with modified scoring rings and body shot score zones. A total of seventeen rounds are shot in each match.
